1. CALL TO ORDER

Co-Chairperson A. Switky called the meeting to order at 12:02 p.m.

2. PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENTS

There were no public announcements.

3. CONSENT AGENDA

It was moved by R. Foust, seconded by C. Chien, and carried by voice vote to approve the consent agenda as submitted, with abstention from A. Switky. For this meeting, the agenda items included the meeting agenda and March 26, 2025, meeting minutes.

4. ACTION ITEMS

4A. San Mateo County Adult & Dislocated Worker Services: NOVAworks has been encountering increased payroll and infrastructure costs. At the same time, funding for workforce development services has diminished. Federal funding that NOVAworks relies on for 80% of its operations has declined due to the end of a multi-year federal grant and few new grant opportunities to pursue. NOVAworks consistently seeks to maximize funding and minimize costs, which has entailed a recent review of its current contracts. As a result, some contracts will not be renewed at the end of their term. The contract with the Central Labor Council Partnership (CLCP), providing adult and dislocated worker services in San Mateo County, represents NOVAworks' largest contract. To reduce costs, NOVAworks is seeking to assume responsibility for providing direct services in San Mateo County in PY 2025-2026 and not renew the current contract with CLCP that ends June 30, 2025. There will be a transition period and the development of a plan to ensure no disruption in services to customers. A long-term plan will also be developed on how NOVAworks can best serve the San Mateo County community. Lambert, and carried by voice vote to complete the current contract with the Central Labor Council Partnership (CLCP) through June 30, 2025, and then provide direct services by NOVAworks staff in San Mateo County in PY 2025-2026.

4B. Approval of 2025 WIOA Memorandums of Understanding (MOU): Every three years, the federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act and the State require that a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) be developed and renewed between the local Workforce Board and mandated partners of the America's Job Centers of California (AJCC). This MOU concerns the operations of the local one-stop

system. In April, NOVAworks began the process of renewing the MOU with its 25 mandated partners for 2025. During this process, there have been delays in receiving feedback from all partners. To minimize any further delays, NOVAworks staff is seeking Board approval for the Board Co-chairs to approve and sign the MOU, on behalf of the full Board, when the MOU process is completed.
